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METHODOLOGY & LOGISTICS

Background

- This report provides the findings of a telephone survey research conducted by Oraclepoll Research Limited for IntegrityBC.

Study Sample

- A total of 600 interviews were conducted among voting age British Columbians between the days of November 22nd and November 25th 2011.
- The margin of error for this survey is $\pm 4\%$, 19/20 times.

Survey Method

- The telephone study sample was selected using random number selection or random digit dialing (RDD). The survey data was conducted using computer-assisted techniques of telephone interviewing (CATI) by the telephone research staff of Oraclepoll Research Limited.
- A total of 20% of all interviews were monitored and the management of Oraclepoll Research Ltd. supervised 100%.

Logistics

- Initial calls were made between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Subsequent callbacks of no-answers and busy numbers were made on a (staggered) daily rotating basis up to 7 times (from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.) until contact was made. In addition, telephone interview appointments were attempted with those respondents unable to complete the survey at the time of contact. If no contact was made at a number after the 7th attempt, the number was discarded.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

TOP OF MIND - OVERALL

Respondents were first asked what they thought were the **most important issues facing BC at this time**. The economy was most named by 18%, followed by 14% that stated health care, 12% jobs or employment, 8% poverty / homelessness, 8% the environment, 6% better government or leadership, 5% education and 4% debt or spending. A total of 7% did not know or had no opinion.

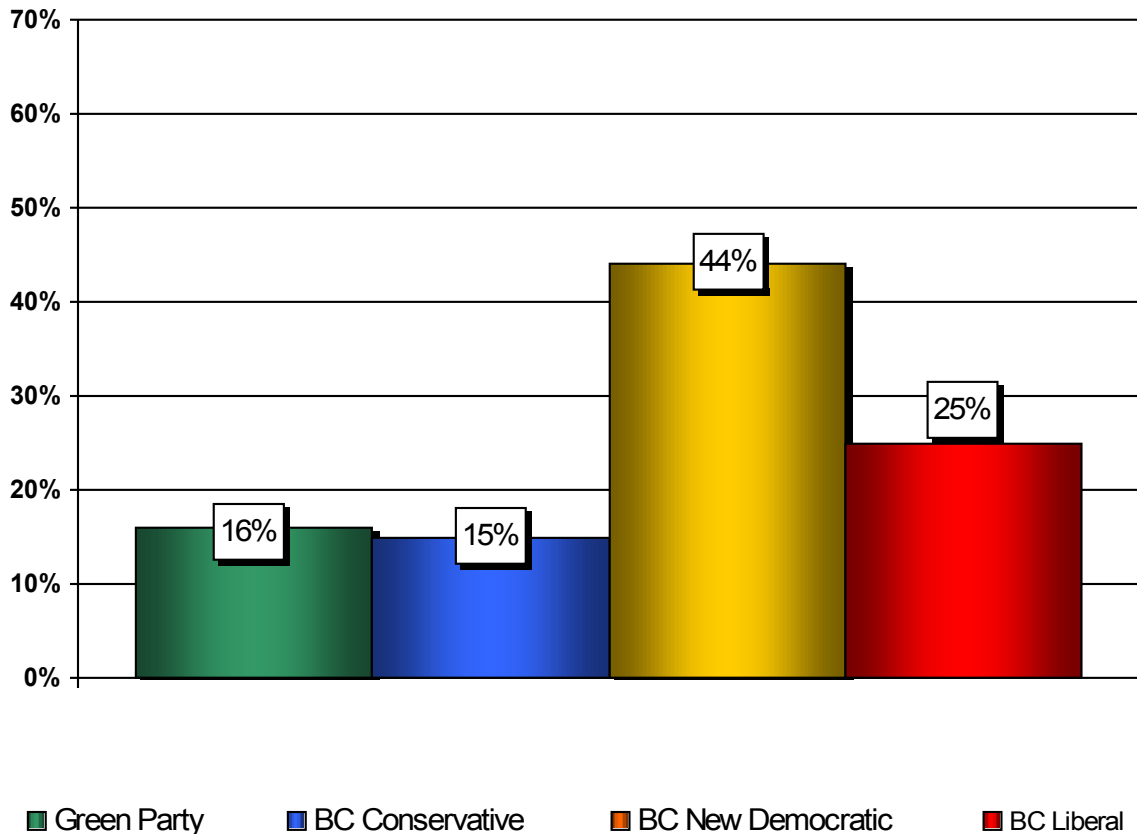
When asked if they felt things in BC were **headed in the right direction or are off on the wrong track**, 48% consider things to be off track, compared to a lesser 37% that said they are going in the right direction, while 15% were unsure.

VOTE INTENT

All respondents were then asked about their **vote intent if a provincial Election** were held.

“If a provincial election were held in today in BC, which of the following Party’s candidates would you most likely vote for?”

IF UNDECIDED “Is there a Party that you are leaning towards?”



44% of decided voters claimed that they would support the BC New Democratic Party, followed by 25% that would back the BC Liberal Party, 16% the Green Party of BC and 15% the BC Conservative Party. A total of 12% of voters were undecided.

Voters are still fluid as 48% said that there is a **chance that they may switch their support for their Party of choice**, 47% will not and 6% did not know. Conservative voters are most likely to change their mind (67%), followed by Green (54%), Liberal (46%) and NDP (39%) supporters.

When **comparing voter choices from the 2009 Election**, the NDP retained most of its support (79%), followed by the Conservatives (67%). The Liberals retained only 44% and the BC Green Party 46% of previous voters.

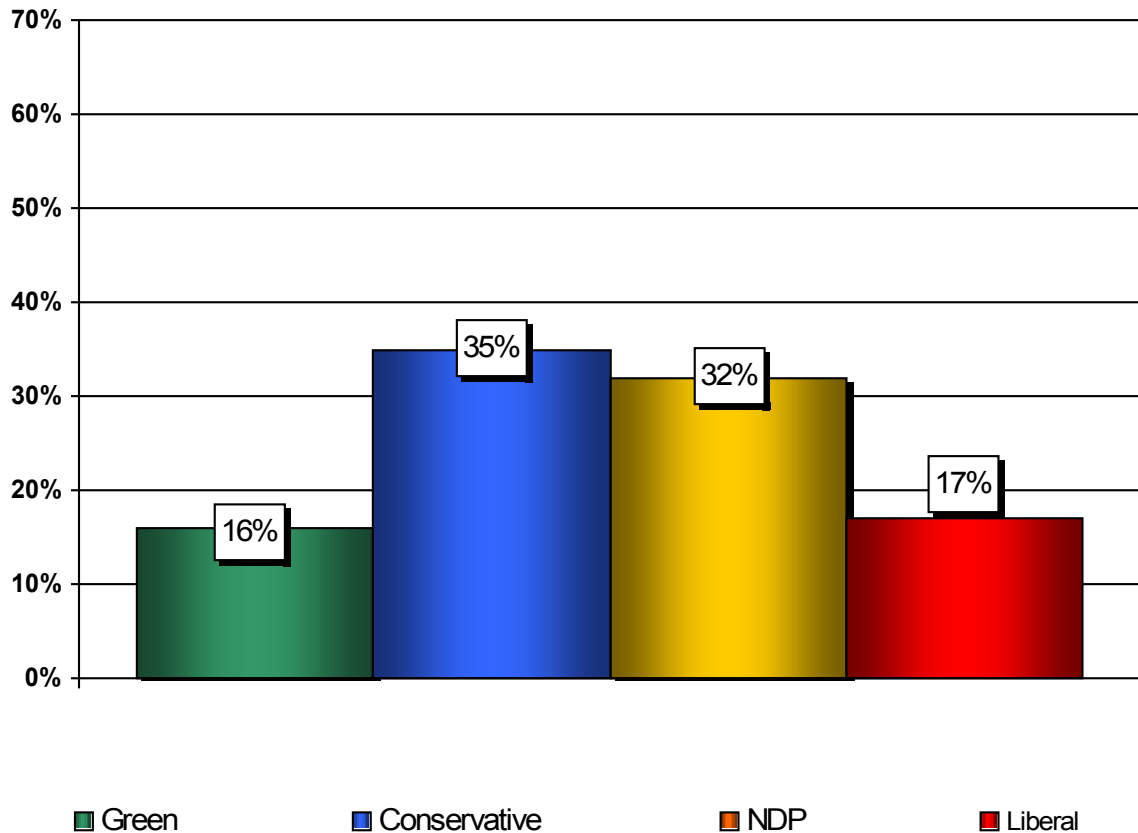
A total of 46% of decided electorate are **basing their vote intent** on a Party preference, a high 30% are voting against another Party, 18% will back a specific candidate and 6% did not know.

Among those voting against another Party, most or 67% named the BC Liberal Party as the reason, while one-quarter or 25% cited the BC New Democrats, only 6% the BC Conservatives and 2% the Green Party. These respondents were further probed to find out **why they are casting a ballot against a Party**, of which 14% named poor economic policies, 11% a poor business knowledge, 10% a dislike of policies, 9% a lack of direction, 8% dishonesty, 8% disliking the Party, 7% a poor track record, 6% the HST and 6% Gordon Campbell.

Respondents were also asked about their **vote intent if a federal Election** were held.

“If a federal Election were held in today in Canada, which of the following Party’s candidates would you most likely vote for?”

IF UNDECIDED “Is there a Party that you are leaning towards?”

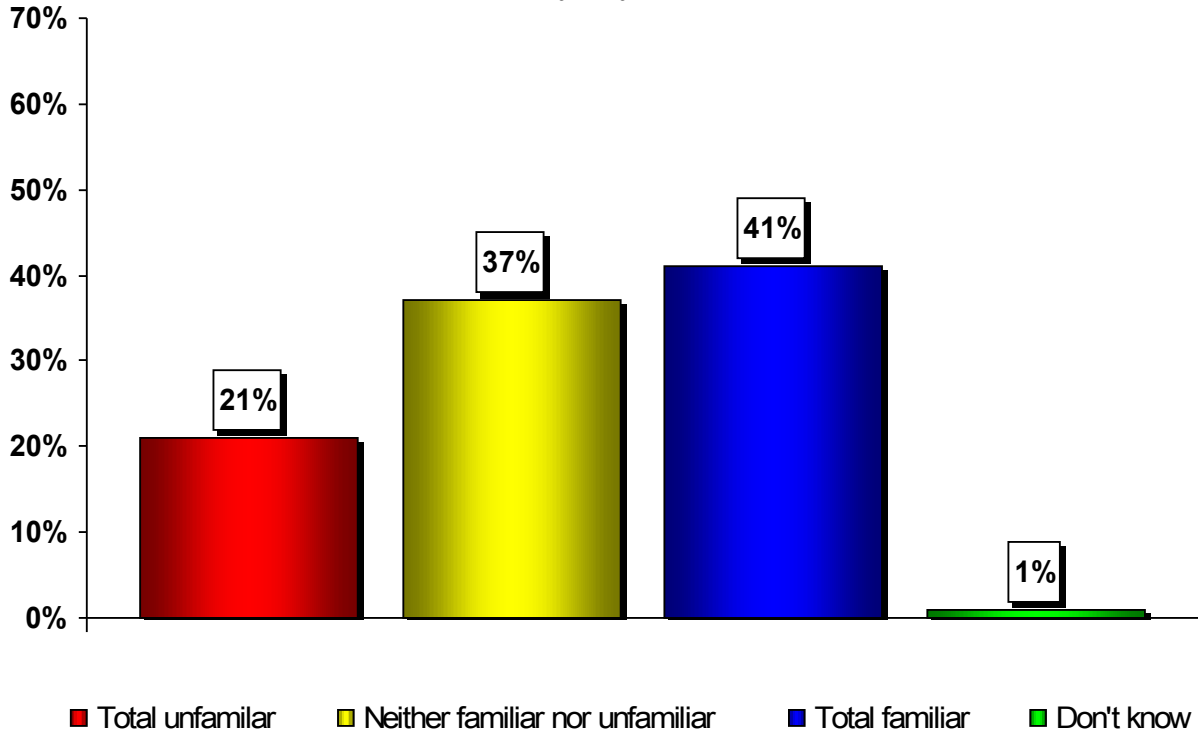


A total of 35% of decided voters stated that they would back the Conservatives, 32% the NDP, followed by 17% that would vote Liberal and 16% the Green Party. A total of 8% of voters were undecided. Among Provincial Liberals, 59% would vote Conservative federally, 32% Liberal, 7% Green and 2% NDP. Most provincial New Democrats or 65% support the federal NDP, 13% the Liberals, 10% the Green Party and 7% the federal Conservatives.

CHRISTY CLARK

Respondents were first asked about their **familiarity with Premier Christy Clark and then if they had a favourable opinion of her.**

"How familiar are you with Premier Christy Clark, leader of the BC Liberals? Please use a scale from one not at all familiar to five very familiar"



A total of 41% of respondents are familiar with Christy Clark, compared to 21% unfamiliar, while 37% were neutral (neither familiar nor unfamiliar) and 1% did not know.

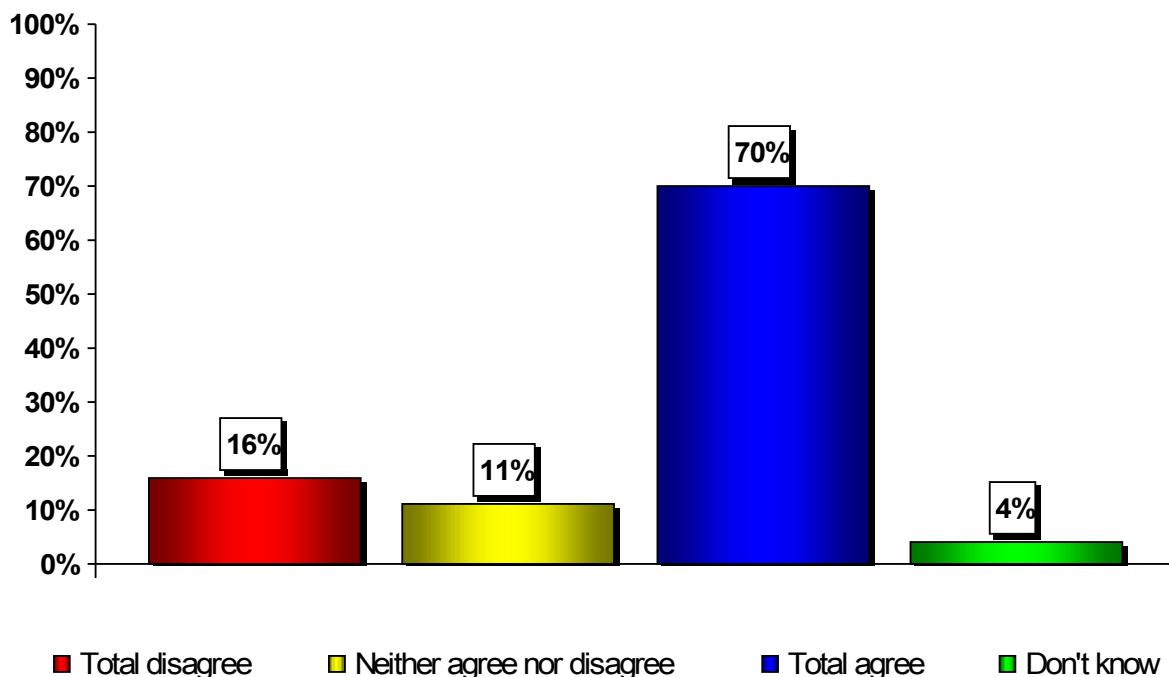
Those with some awareness of Clark were then **asked to rate their opinion of her**, with only 24% having a favorable view of the Liberal leader, 47% an unfavourable one, 27% a neutral or neither favourable nor unfavourable opinion, while 2% were unsure. A follow up open ended question was asked where those surveyed were **allowed to describe Christy Clark**. A total of 11% could not name anything, but 11% said she is energetic, 10% dislike her, 8% called her unintelligent, 8% dishonest, 8% that she is doing a poor job, 6% opportunistic, 6% knowledgeable, 6% personable and 5% a politician.

All respondents were first read the following **preamble about Christy Clark and were then asked to rate their level of agreement with it.**

“In May this year Christy Clark ran in a by-election in Vancouver-Point Grey but did not attend any all candidates’ meetings saying that she was busy doing other things.”

“Please rate your level of agreement with the following statement using a scale from one strongly disagree to five strongly agree.”

***“Knowing this makes me have a more unfavourable opinion c
Christy Clark?”***

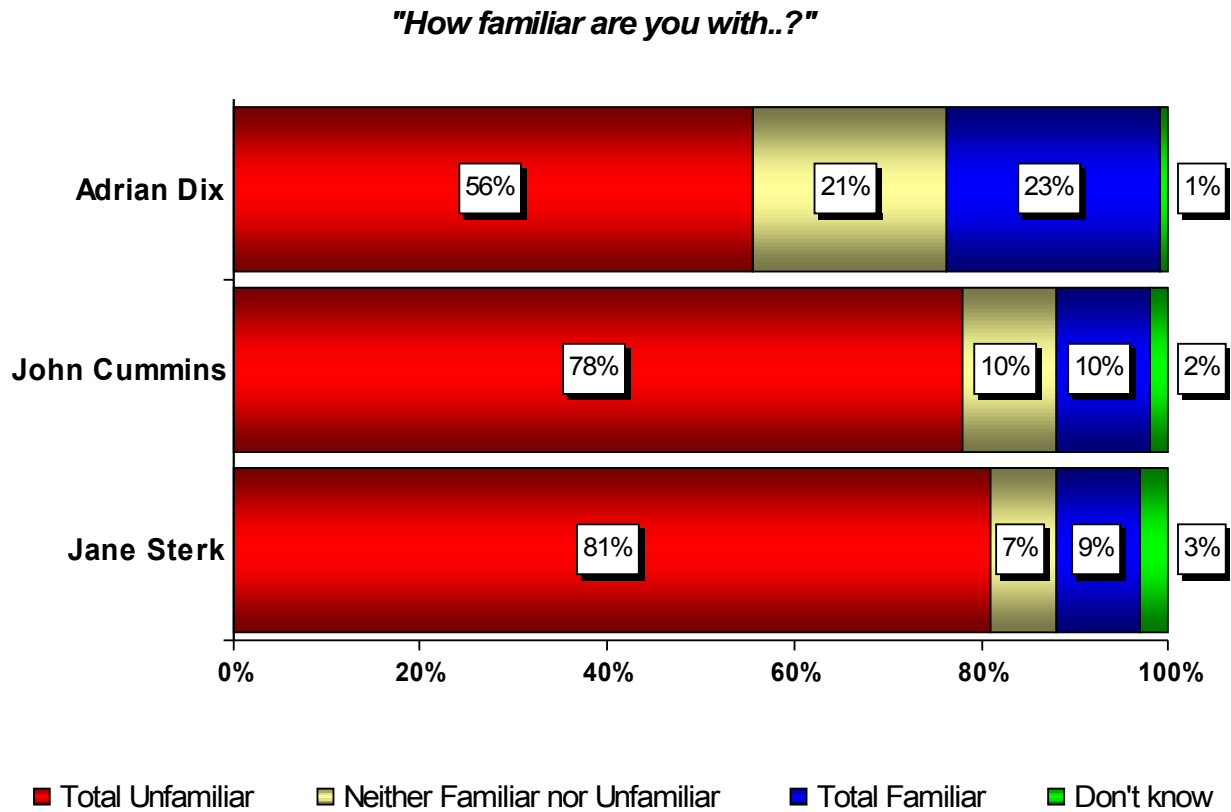


A strong seven in ten (70%) agreed that knowing that Clark did not attend any all candidates meetings during the by-election made them have a more unfavourable opinion of her.

In addition, a very high 92% of BC residents agreed that it is **important for candidates to attend all candidates meetings during elections to answer questions from the media and from voters.**

PARTY LEADERS

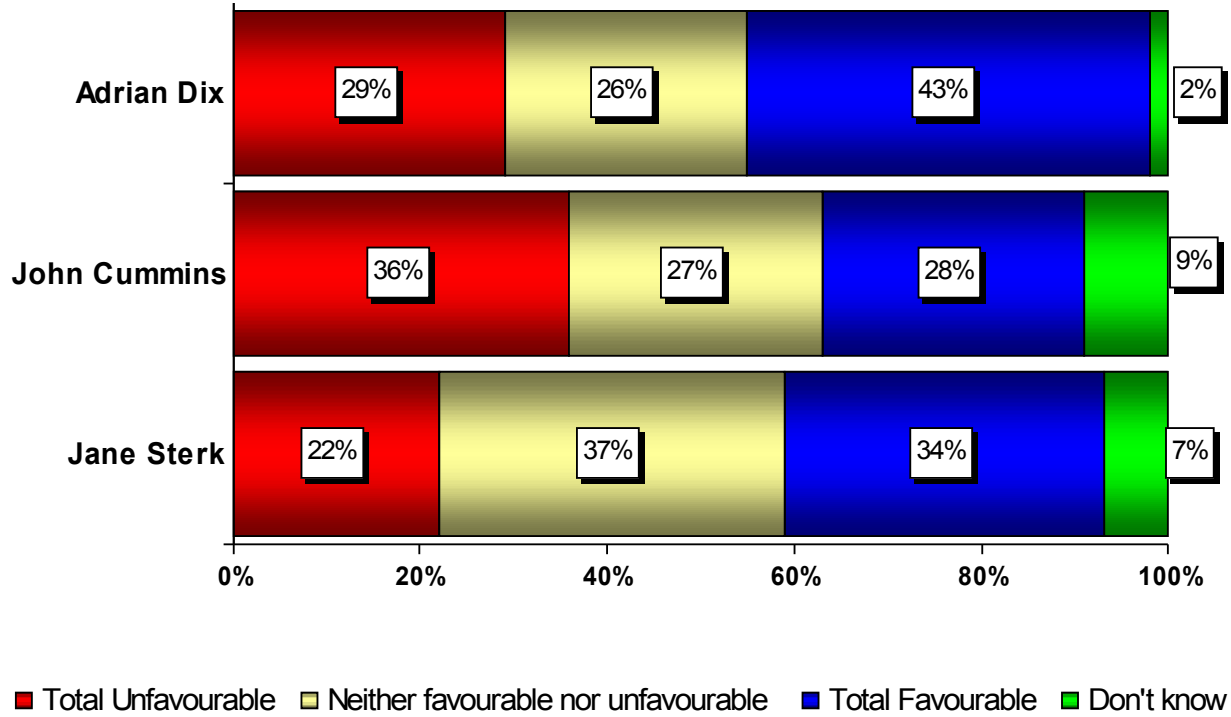
Respondents were also asked to rate their **familiarity with all of the other Party leaders**.



Awareness was highest for BC NDP leader Adrian Dix, but familiarity was far lower for BC Conservative head John Cummins and Jane Sterk of the Green Party.

Those with some awareness of Dix, Cummins and Sterk were then **asked to rate their opinion of each one of them,**

"Overall, how favourable is your opinion of..?"



Total favourable ratings were highest for Adrian Dix, followed by Jane Sterk and lowest for John Cummins.

AGREEMENT

All respondents were asked **to rate their level of agreement with the following statements related to donations to political parties.**

LEVEL OF AGREEMENT	Percent
People living outside of British Columbia should be prohibited from donating to BC political parties	44%
Unions and corporations should be prohibited from donating to BC political parties	52%
There should be limits on how much money any one person can donate to BC election campaigns	76%

There was a strong belief among more than three quarters that limits should be placed on the donations provided by donors, but less so for special interest and out of province contributions.

Respondents were then asked **to rate their level of agreement with the following statements related to trust and honesty.**

Almost all of those interviewed are of the opinion that it is important for BC politicians to tell the truth and a very strong majority agrees it is important for them to keep their promises.

However, the BC Liberals and Christy Clark have a low level of trust among the electorate when it comes to trust and keeping promises, and less than four in ten trust her more than Gordon

Campbell. Voters do not feel that the current Liberal government listens to them and few believe that they try hard in the legislative assembly to answer tough questions from the opposition. Low marks are also given to the Clark Liberals for being open, transparent and accountable.

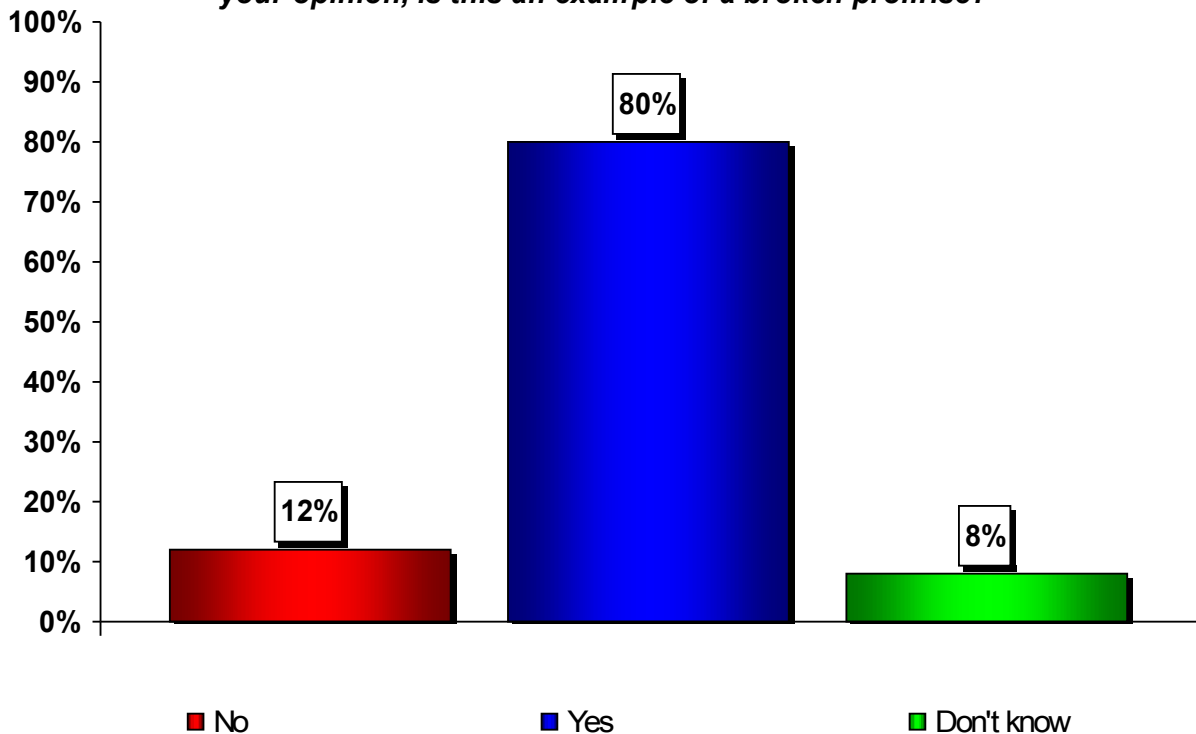
While slightly more have trust in the NDP and Dix to tell the truth, when it comes to forming the next government, a low number of British Columbians believe that they will keep their promises.

BC Rail

Respondents were first asked about the **promise that the BC Liberals made in 2001 not to sell BC Rail** of which 49% were familiar with the promise, 33% unfamiliar, 16% neither familiar nor unfamiliar and 2% were unsure.

They were then asked the following.

"Despite making the promise not to sell BC Rail, the Liberal government leased it to Canadian National Railway for 990 years. In your opinion, is this an example of a broken promise?"



Eight in ten BC residents interviewed are of the belief that the leasing of BC Rail for 990 years is an example of a broken promise.

In addition, the BC Liberal position that it was not sold but was leased is still viewed by 76% voters as **an example of politicians lying in an attempt to cover up a broken promise.**

Respondents were also asked about their familiarity with **the criminal charges laid against former BC Liberal staffers Basi and Virk** who pled guilty to accepting bribes in the BC Rail scandal. A total of 57% were familiar with the charges, 25% unfamiliar, 16% neither familiar nor unfamiliar and 2% responded do not know.

Respondents were read a short preamble and then were asked **to rate their level of agreement with the following statements related to the BC Rail scandal.**

‘While the Basi and Virk criminal charges were before the courts the BC Liberals refused to answer any questions about BC Rail whether they related to Mr. Basi and Mr. Virk or otherwise. The NDP have tabled 100 questions in the legislature which remain unanswered.’

There is a strong belief that the BC Liberals need to answer the unanswered questions and a n almost seven in ten majority feel that the Liberals are hiding something and that a public inquiry should be held.

OTHER ISSUES

Respondents were first asked to **rate their level of agreement with the following three statements.**

There are many British Columbians who feel that the economic system and democracy is not working well for them and that they have been left out	61%

Only 39% of British Columbians feel that the Clark Liberals handled the HST referendum in an open and honest manner. There was moderately strong buy-in to the belief that there are BC residents being left out of the economic and political system and there is subsequent sympathy for them.

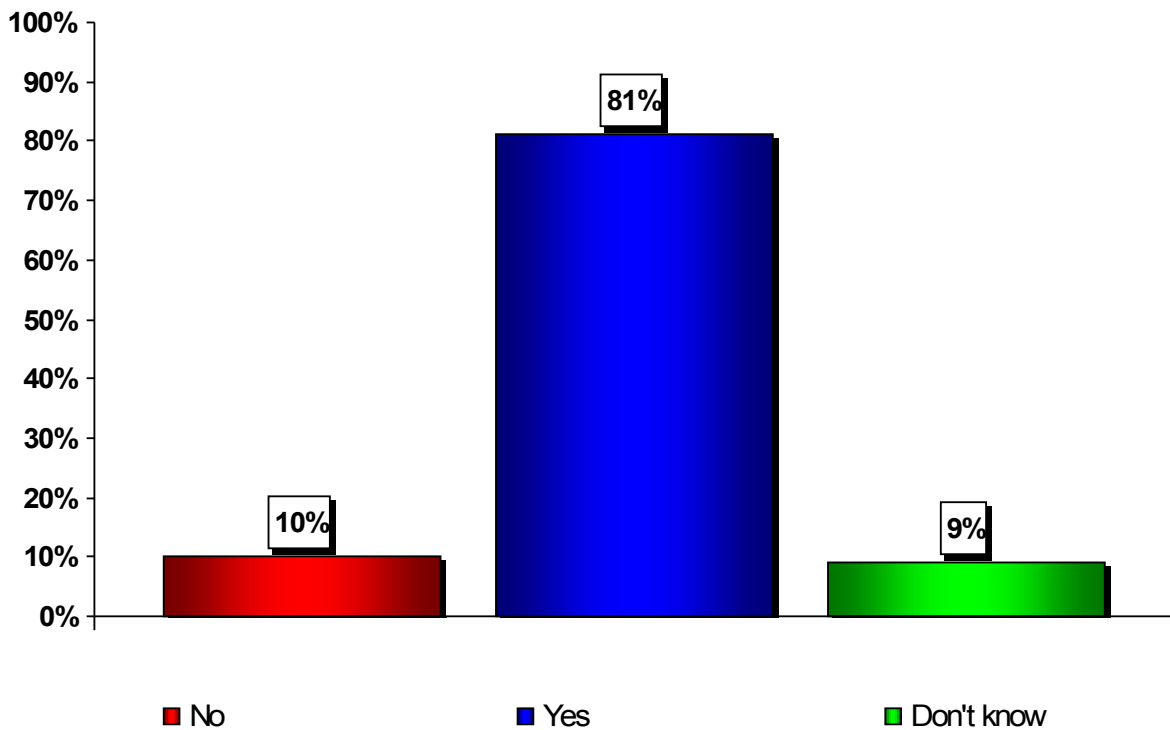
INTEGRITY BC

A total of **6% of survey respondents claimed that they have heard of IntegrityBC.**

All respondents were then **read the following preamble about IntegrityBC and then asked a follow up question.**

“IntegrityBC is a non-profit, non-partisan group of citizens who are working to prohibit business and union funding of political parties and who are trying to get politicians to keep more of their promises and be more truthful.”

“In your opinion, does BC need a group such as IntegrityBC?”



A total of 81% feel that it is important to have a group such as IntegrityBC.
